

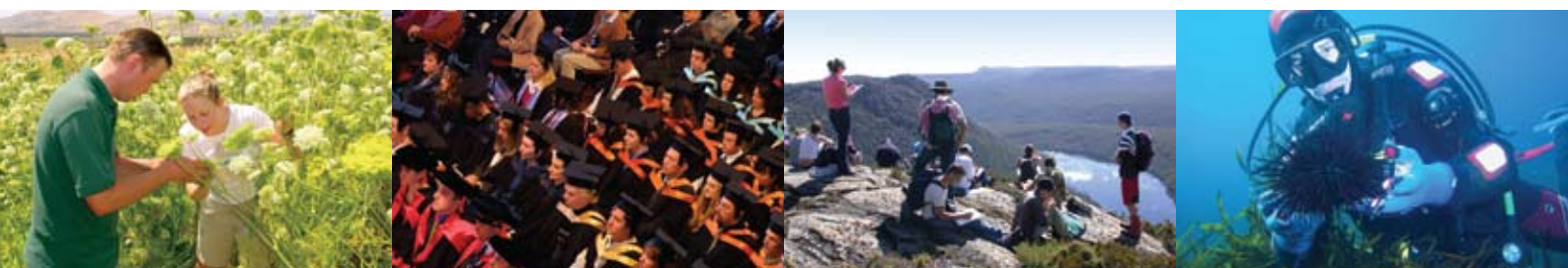

Indigenous Graduate Research Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by the University of Tasmania.

Value Equal to that of the Australian Postgraduate Awards (currently \$20,427 per year)

Number 1

Duration Up to two years for a research masters degree

Up to three years for a doctorate

Criteria Available to a student who will be undertaking a full-time research masters degree or doctorate in 2010 and who holds or will obtain in 2009 at least an upper second-class honours degree.

In addition, applicants must be Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people who meet the Commonwealth three-tiered criteria for Aboriginality. This requires that an Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person:

- is of Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent; and
- identifies as an Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander; and
- is accepted as such by the community in which he or she lives or has lived.

Conditions A relocation allowance may also be included.

Qantas Tasmanian Devil Research Scholarship

Qantas, the national airline, has provided funds to assist research into the facial tumour disease affecting devil populations.

Value Up to Australian Postgraduate Award level

Number 1

Duration 3.5 years

Criteria Additional research funding may be available.

Quantitative Marine Science PhD Scholarships

These scholarships are provided by CSIRO in partnership with the University of Tasmania as part of a national program to offer specialised graduate-level coursework in quantitative marine science (QMS).

Value \$23,205 (current 2009 rate)

Number Varies

Duration Up to three years

Criteria Available to students who hold at least an upper second-class honours degree, or equivalent, and have a major in mathematics, physical sciences, life sciences, geomatics or engineering.

Tasmanian Early Years Foundation Scholarships

The Tasmanian Early Years Foundation was established by the Tasmanian Government in 2005 to support and promote the development and learning of children up to the age of six. These scholarships will help further research into the early years of life.

Value \$10,000 per year

Number 2

Duration Up to three years

Criteria Available to students who are undertaking a postgraduate education degree (masters or PhD) incorporating research into the field of children's early learning and development and/or research into the development and education of early years professionals in Tasmania. Preference will be given to action research or research with a practical and reflective focus. Interested applicants should check the details provided on the scholarships website.

The Dr Joan Woodberry Postgraduate Fellowship in Engineering or Bioscience

This fellowship is provided by Dr Joan Woodberry AM, who has had a major influence on young Australians through her writing, teaching and educating teachers and in advocating for women's rights.

She has endowed this fellowship to assist women graduates to continue with their university education in the fields of engineering and the biosciences.

Value \$3,000 per year top-up

Number 1

Duration Three years

Criteria Available to a woman graduate undertaking a masters degree or doctorate in engineering or the biosciences.
